Mathematics in the home #16

Ways to help your child learn mathematical ideas at home:

Set the table for dinner

- Practice one to one correspondence:
 - Match the number of knives / forks / spoons to the number of people to be seated
- Ask questions like:
 - “How many knives/forks will be needed if 4 or 6 people are eating?”
 - “How many chairs will be needed for the number of people to be seated?”
 - “How many chair legs will there be altogether at the table?”
 - “When will the dinner take place?” Mark a date and time on the family calendar
 - Make requests like: “I’d like us to plan a dinner three weeks from today. What will that date be?”
 - “How many days are left until the dinner date?”
 - Possible answers could include: “A week”, “A fortnight”, “A month”, “Three days to go.”

Other ways to help your child include:

Use everyday opportunities to make mathematics visible

- Remember your child’s learning may look different to yours.
- There can be a number of ways to solve a mathematical problem.
- Don’t say “That’s wrong”, say “How did you get your answer?”
- Encourage your child to talk through their thinking
- Allow your child time to think - don’t rush in and give them the answer - wait and listen.

Our Lady of Lourdes, Baulkham Hills School Captains and Student Representative Council Election

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to have clear procedures to elect our School Captains and Student Representative Council.

Implementation

- Principal or Assistant Principal address year 5 on the role of School Captains / SRC
- Year 5 students nominate, on paper, two boys and two girls who they would like to represent them on the SRC
- Students may nominate themselves
- The six students with most nominations become the candidates for School Captain / SRC
- Each candidate presents a speech on how they could contribute to the role of SRC and the qualities they would bring to this position
- Each Year 5 student is given a voting form with the candidates' names which they order in preference from 1 to 6
- The preferential voting system is used
- The 3 candidates with the most votes become the SRC (3 boys and 3 girls)
- The candidates with the most votes become School Captain (1 boy 1 girl)
- The names of the SRC are given to the parish priest, staff, school, and the school community via the school newsletter
- The Principal / A P has the right to overrule any nominees they feel would not be suitable for the position

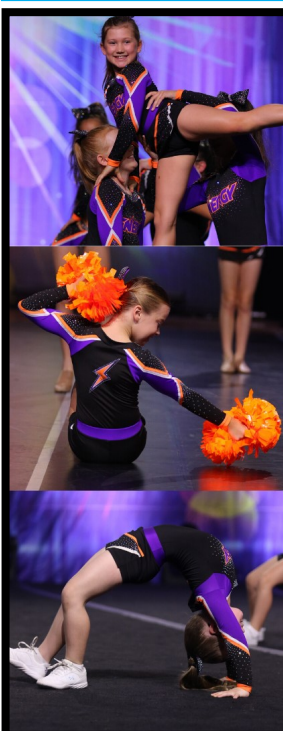

Duties of Core Group Office Bearers

President

- Presides as Chairperson at all meetings
- Ensures the smooth running of all meetings
- Ensures the meetings run on time
- Prepares the agenda for General Meetings/Annual General Meetings in collaboration with the other members of the Core Group
- Liaises with the Principal and Parish Priest to prepare the agenda for the Core Group Meetings
- Liaises with the Principal and Parish Priest at all times

Vice-President

- Assists the President in his/her duties as required
- Presides as Chairperson at meetings in the absence of the President

Secretary

- Takes minutes of all meetings
- Ensures minutes are signed by the Chairperson at the next meeting
- Receives and deals with correspondence
- Maintains copies of correspondence, bulletins and minute books
- Gives notice of the agenda to all members

Treasurer

- Receives all monies and keeps accurate records of monies received
- Obtains and keeps receipts for all monies paid by the Parent body
- Banks all monies received
- Presents at each General Meeting a statement of accounts showing receipts and expenditure for the period together with the current balance
- Presents at the Annual General Meeting an audited statement of accounts
- Presents at the Annual General Meeting an anticipated set of accounts for the year ahead (as approved by the Core Body) for approval or amendment by The Parent Body

OLOL Parents and Friends Association Sub-Committee Positions and Responsibilities

OLOL Parents and Friends PRC Representative

This vital position acts a conduit to understand key programs and activities that are happening throughout the diocese and how they may relate to Our Lady of Lourdes School and Parish.

Key activities involve:

- Representing our School at PRC General Meetings once a term. (4 meetings per year).
- Relaying any relevant information for these meetings in particular parent workshops to OLOL Parent Community via the weekly OLOL Newsletters.
- Attend and provide written reports at the OLOL Parent Group Meetings held each term. (4 meetings per year).

OLOL Parish Liaison Officer

This role requires active participation in the Parish and Parish Community with the primary responsibility of working collaboratively with the Parish Priests, Parish Staff, Pastoral Council, School Principal and the SRC Executive on ways of making the Family Ministry stronger.

Key activities include:

- Attend Parish Community meetings as required (4 per year).
- Act as the primary liaison officer between the Parish Priest, Parish Staff and the OLOL Executive Staff and OLOL Principal.
- Provide opportunities for the formation of families e.g. talks, discussion groups, faith and spiritual formation.
- Link families who connect with the Parish i.e. through the sacraments to the life of the Parish.
- Attend OLOL Parent Group Meetings each term and providing a written report for each of these meetings. (4 meetings per year).

OLOL Social & Fundraising Coordinator

This role is vital in the planning, management and execution of events and activities which address the twin objectives of fostering school and community spirit together with raising money. This role requires support from the school community.

This role reports directly to the OLOL Parent Group President and final decisions lay with the core group in conjunction with the school principal.

Key activities include forming a Social & Fundraising Committee, where the coordinator will plan, manage, delegate and oversee ALL social & fundraising activities for the year, in conjunction with the OLOL Parent Core Group, including but not limited to the following 'standard events':



Parameters for P&F Annual General Meeting

Nomination forms will be made available fourteen days prior to the annual AGM.

Nominations

- Nominations must be handed to the school office or scanned and emailed by 3:30pm on the day of the AGM
- Members of the P&F exec are not to second nominations
- Nominees who are absent from the AGM must accept before the AGM commences in writing, or in person, to accept the nomination, if elected
- People must be in attendance at the AGM to vote
- If a position attracts no nominees it is opened to the floor at the AGM, if there are still no nominees it is opened to the school community. If more than one person volunteers from the school community, a name will be selected randomly by the Principal and Assistant Principal
- Sub-committee nominations will be taken from the floor. If more than one person nominates themselves a secret ballot will take place

Voting

- The quorum for an AGM shall be members, not including ex officio members
- Voting is open to parents, guardians of pupils of the school and parishioners of the parish
- If there is more than one nomination for a position, voting is done by secret ballot
- The Principal and Assistant Principal will conduct each election and declare the results. If one of them is absent another school exec member will assist
- In the event of a tied vote, a name will be selected randomly

Hand-Over

After the AGM a hand-over will occur for each role as per the hand-over document for each role. This handover will be scheduled at a suitable time as close to the finalisation of Core Group roles as possible.
