Religions Education in the Classroom - Year 6


The commencement of 2019 has been a very busy time for Year 6. As school leaders with many new responsibilities, buddies to our kindergarten students and enthusiasm for our final year in primary school - we have had an energetic start to the year.

In Week 4, Year 6 presented their first assembly to the students of Our Lady of Lourdes. They processed into the church with their buddies. We listened to the Gospel reading and welcomed new school members.







In Religion, we have studied the values contained on our school's Values Statement, looked at our school emblem and the meaning of its symbols. We also explored the significance of our motto, "to know, to love and to serve", and its impact on us as senior students of our school community.



Our first Religious Education unit for this term was 'Servant Leadership'. In this unit, we explored many scripture passages from the bible showing leadership. Some of the readings included - Moses who was solemnly commissioned to lead his people out of Egypt and into freedom and in John's Gospel where Jesus dramatically represents his style of leadership by washing the feet of his disciples. Each of these readings related to the qualities required to be a good leader.



Our Lenten unit this year is 'A Time for Reconciliation'. In this unit we will study 'The Parable of the Prodigal Son'. We will also analyse and interpret the parable's purpose and message within the context of the Lent and the celebration of the sacrament of Penance.



Mathematics in the home

Ways to help your child learn mathematical ideas at home:



- Play an object hunt eg locate 3D shapes around us
- Look for shapes that tessellate
- Complete puzzles and tangrams together
- Follow a map when travelling
- Look for symmetry in the environment eg a butterfly
- Build with construction equipment eg Lego



Other ways to help your child include:

Use everyday opportunities to make mathematics visible

- Remember your child's learning may look different to yours.
- There can be a number of ways to solve a mathematical problem.
- Don't say "That's wrong", say "How did you get your answer?"
- Encourage your child to talk through their thinking
- Allow your child time to think don't rush in and give them the answer wait and listen.
- Use the language of space and geometry eg flat, round, curved, under, over eg "I'm hiding the teddy under the cushion, "I'm hiding the teddy behind the cushion."


