


Project Based Learning

Recently our year three and four teachers attended Professional learning on Project Based Learning (PBL).

PBL is a mode of instruction where students investigate and respond to an authentic question, problem or challenge. The focus is on students developing 21st Century skills. It begins with a driving question and ends with a presentation and reflection. What the students create will show their understanding and mastery of content and skills.

Years Three and Four will be engaging in some PBL units in various Key Learning Areas.



<u>Naplan</u>
The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assess literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3 and 5 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. This year the NAPLAN will be online for all assessments except the Year 3 Writing. The timetable is: Tuesday, 14th May Language Conventions and Writing Wednesday, 15th May Thursday, 16th May Numeracy.

Mathematics in the home # 6

Ways to help your child learn mathematical ideas at home:

- Do jigsaw puzzles together
- Makes mazes and maps ... treasure map for birthday party
- Build things using construction kits, cards, dominoes and block .. view objects created from different positions ... front, side and top.
- Draw their construction from different points of view
- Experiment with graphics programs and manipulate by flipping, rotating, sliding and turning
- Discuss why some shapes and objects are used more than others.
- Discuss the properties of different shapes e.g., this will roll because it is round.


Other ways to help your child include:


Use everyday opportunities to make mathematics visible

- Remember your child's learning may look different to yours.
- There can be a number of ways to solve a mathematical problem.
- Don't say "That's wrong", say "How did you get your answer?"
- Encourage your child to talk through their thinking
- Allow your child time to think don't rush in and give them the answer wait and listen.

Parking Rules & Penalties

Council's Compliance Officers enforce parking signs at your school.

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. When an offence is detected, you will be fined.



NO STOPPING

You must not STOP at any time.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points



NO PARKING

You can stop only to drop off or pick

up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$187 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONES

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points



DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points



There are now increased penalties and demerit points associated with all offences in School Zones.



NO PARKING

You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

Penalty from \$187 and 2 demerit points



NO STOPPING

Under no cicumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping Sign applies.



Application for invitation to the NSWPSSA Selection Trials for the 2019 School Sport Australia Track & Field Championships.

This trial is <u>not</u> for participation at the NSWPSSA State Athletics Championships held on 6 and 7 November 2019. Students will need to qualify for these championships through their school and association representative pathway.

In 2019 the School Sport Australia Track and Field Championships will be held in the Northern Territory.

Due to extreme heat conditions in Darwin during November/December when the National Track and Field Championships are traditionally held, this year's SSA event will be held from the 18-23 September 2019.

In order to select a NSW representative track & field team for this event, the NSWPSSA will be holding a special selection trial.

Participation at these trials will be via a formal application to NSWPSSA and athletes MUST compete at this event to achieve selection in the 2019 NSW representative team.

An entry fee will be applicable to successful athletes.

Age eligibility:

Participants must be in at least their tenth year (turning ten during the year of competition) in order to compete at a School Sport Australia Championship as per School Sport Australia policy.

There are no events at the SSA 12 Years & Under Championships for competitors under ten or turning thirteen.

All athletes <u>must</u> apply using the form provided and include a verifiable official time, distance or height that meets the minimum qualifying requirements listed below, for each event he/she is applying for.

Completion of this application <u>does not quarantee</u> the right to compete at these trials as there are strict entry limits for all events. The convener will consider all applications and send invitations and further information electronically to successful athletes.

Please note:

Any athletes who attend on the day without a formal invitation or approval will be unable to compete.

Notes on Qualifying Times, Distances & Weights

- For throws, the implement weight should be added eg 500g, 2kg etc.
- All official times, distances or heights must have been achieved at a school, PSSA
 or official athletics event after August 1, 2018 and must be verifiable. Please submit
 the name of a school or athletics official who can verify submissions and/or supply
 a link to an online verification source such as a PSSA or Little Athletics website e.g.
 regional or state championships results.

Important information:

- Late applications will not be considered.
- Any student competing at the selection trials must be available to attend the School Sport Australia Track and Field Championships in Darwin everyday between Wednesday 18 and Monday 23 September 2019 inclusive.
- Only students invited to the Selection Trial will be considered for the state team and these students must compete at the trial to gain a position.


