The Gospel reading for this Sunday is taken from Luke 15:1-10

There will be joy in heaven over one sinner who does penance.

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his

shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.

'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

Y9-12: This Friday the 20th of September, come to the Downey Room from 7-9pm for a night of food, games and activities as we break open the theme of sanctity!

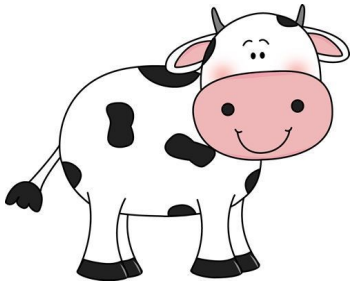

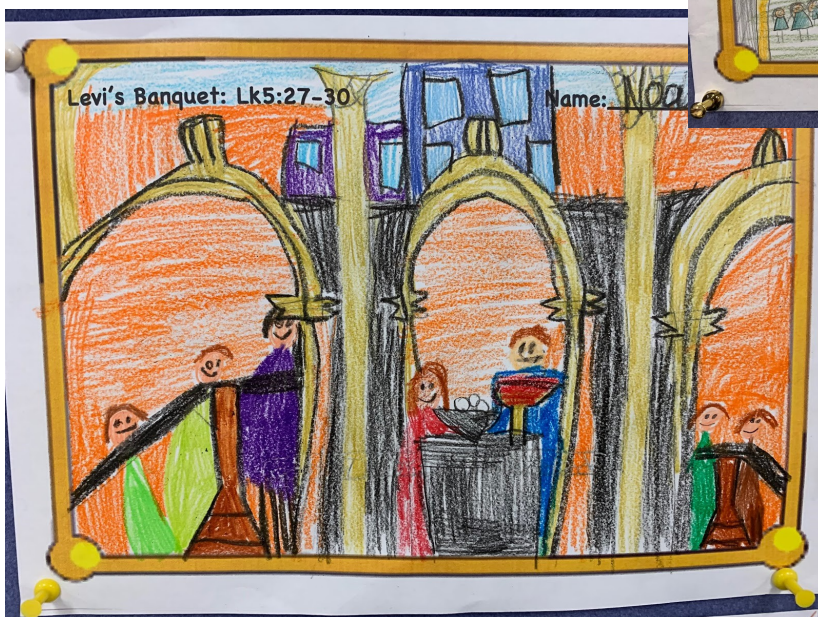
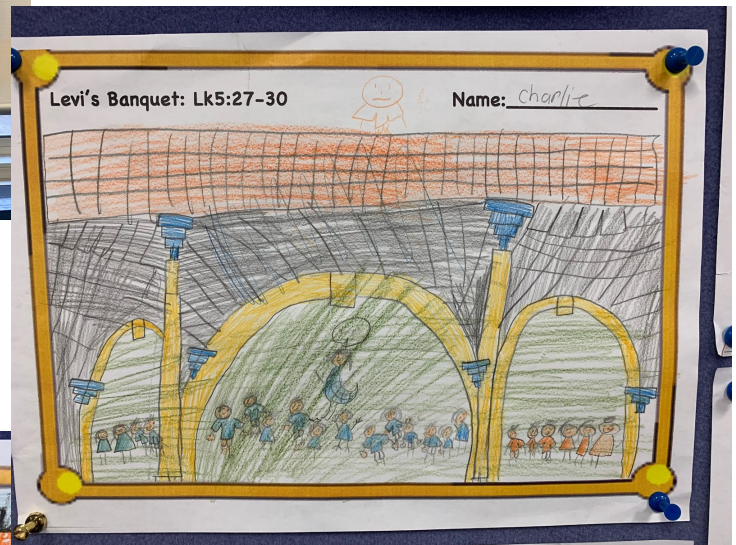
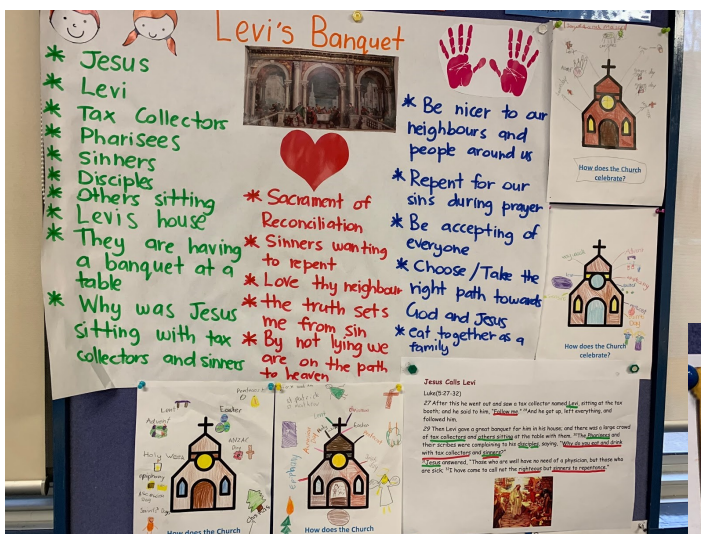
Religion in Year 2

This term, Year 2 have been learning about the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This unit highlights God's love being revealed in the gift of Jesus in the celebration of the Eucharist. The students grow in the knowledge that in the Eucharist, the Christian community remembers and celebrates Jesus' presence.

In the Eucharist, the Church celebrates God's love, Jesus' presence in the people of the parish, the priest, the Word of God and in Holy Communion.

Year 2 have been reading about the story of Levi's banquet and Jesus Feeding the 5000. We realise how important it is to celebrate and share meals with family and friends.

These are our interpretations of what Levi's banquet would have looked like after researching images of Levi's banquet.



Mathematics in the home #12

Ways to help your child learn mathematical ideas at home:

- **Measuring the capacities of containers:**

- Collect a range of containers and talk about how much it could hold
- Compare with other containers of different shapes and sizes
- Test to check predictions
- Talk about what you notice

Eg **"I think the tall bottle will hold more than the large bowl"**

"I think this because it is big and tall."

- **Knock them down skittles:**

- Partly fill 10 plastic bottles with water or sand to give stability
- Arrange in rows in a triangular shape (like 10-pin bowling)
- Bowl a ball to knock them down
- Discuss how many were knocked down. Subtract from the ten, how many left?

Eg **"I knocked down 4 pins. That leaves 6 still standing to make the 10."**

"If I knocked down 4, my brother needs to knock down at least 5 to beat me."

- **Play dough shapes**

- Follow a recipe to make your own play dough with your child
- Make different shapes with the play dough. Discuss.

Eg **"What do you notice about your shape?"**

"What is the same and different about our shapes?"

"How can you describe what is the same?"

"How can you describe what is different?"



Other ways to help your child include:

Use everyday opportunities to make mathematics visible

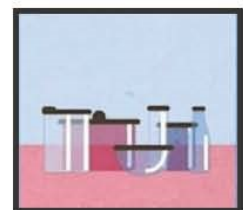
- Remember your child's learning may look different to yours.
- There can be a number of ways to solve a mathematical problem.
- Don't say "That's wrong", say "How did you get your answer?"
- Encourage your child to talk through their thinking
- Allow your child time to think - don't rush in and give them the answer - wait and listen.
